VICTORY - Revelation 19-22**

TWO CONFIDENCE-BUILDING TRUTHS
OF COMPLETE VICTORY IN JESUS:

**OUR VICTORY FLOWS OUT OF
HIS IMMENSE POWER.**

Colossians 1:16-17: Christ's preeminence over creation—"in Him all things hold together."

John 1:1-5: The Word as the source of life and light, overpowering darkness.

Hebrews 7:25: "He always lives to intercede for them."

**OUR VICTORY FLOWS OUT OF
HIS TIMELESS PRESENCE.**

**THE CULMINATION OF ALL OF
REVELATION: "WE LIVE FROM
VICTORY, NOT FOR VICTORY"**

START PRAYING:

King Jesus! You are worthy of infinite praise, and we're honored to be invited into the eternal chorus that never stops proclaiming your goodness, holiness, grace and mercy! There is none like You, King of Kings and Lord of Lords. We thank you for choosing to exercise your mighty power for our benefit, for our good, for our salvation. Help us to be increasingly full of praise for our ability to have relationship with you and to walk through life by Your side. Protect us from pride and from taking your love and kindness for granted. Teach us to hate our sin and to live in confidence in your power. In Jesus' name, amen!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

START TALKING:

Are you a "let's get dress up for special events" kind of person or are you a "I just want to be comfortable" kind of person?

START THINKING:

Read Revelation 19:11-21 & 20:10, 20:14-15, as a group. Spend a few minutes making observations quietly. Then share your observations with the group.

Follow-up: What stands out to you about Jesus' power, judgment, or victory in these verses?

Revelation 19:15 says Jesus will strike down the nations with the sword of His mouth, representing His Word. Why is Jesus' Word so powerful?

Follow-up: How does this shape the way you approach Scripture in your own life?

Context: Throughout this series, we've been making the claim that "every bad thing people criticize God for allowing to happen, is not allowed. Revelation is God showing us that He did not miss a single thing—He will right every wrong and punish every injustice. And every wrong deed is either something Jesus faced the punishment for on behalf of the repentant sinner or the wicked ones will face themselves at God's hand."

Question: How do the passages we read in Revelation 19:11-16, 20:10, and 20:14-15 help you understand that claim?

Follow-up: What does this teach you about God's character and His justice?

START SHARING:

What was your favorite part of this message and why?

What is one or two things from this series that you will carry with you through life?

Looking at Rev 19:14, why is the clothing choice of Jesus and His army such an important detail?

Follow-up: What does it mean for us to "wear fine, white linen" as Christians?

In this message it was said, "We're not fighting for victory; we're living from it." How does this truth change how you handle challenges or setbacks?

Context: The key thought from this message is that when Jesus saves us, "He saves us from something to something." This happens in an eternal sense, and also in an immediate sense. **Sermon example:** From pornography to purity, not from pornography to insatiable lust. Pastor Jeff proposed that many Christian struggles are rooted in resisting the part where God is leading us "to something" rather than just saving us "from something."

Question: Spend some quality time discussing this principle, ensuring everyone in the group understands it well.

Follow-up: What is God saving you to? Or do you have a story of how you experienced this already?

Follow-up: Have you ever felt stuck in the "from" part of your salvation/sanctification? If stuck now, how can you get unstuck?

START DOING:

Memorize Revelation 19:14 this week, and always remember that you're a white linen warrior, already living in victory.
